#### What is Prophecy?

1. The Proclamation of the Will of God, both present and future.

#### God used Prophets in the OT and NT

#### Prophecy comes only from God... not People

For prophecy never had its origin in the human will, but prophets, though human, spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.

-2 Pet 1:21

#### 1/3 of the Bible's 66 books were authored by Prophets in the OT.

#### 4 of the NT Books are primarily prophetic

Revelation1 ThessaloniansJude2 Thessalonians

#### 27% of the Bible includes Prophecy

# OT & NT <u>Prophets</u> spoke for God in 2 Ways...

Forth-tellingFore-telling

#### Most was "Forth-telling"

They were proclaiming the known Word and Will of God to His People, urging them to turn from their sin, and warning them what would happen if they did not repent.

# The Most Important Prophecies point to the <u>Coming</u> of Christ

#### • 120 were fulfilled with His First Coming!

#### 300 Prophecies concern Christ's Second Coming!

"Do not think that I came to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I did not come to abolish but to fulfill. "For truly I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not the smallest letter or stroke shall pass from the Law until all is accomplished."

#### Why we study Unfulfilled Prophecy

All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work.

-2 Tim 3:16-18

- It gives us Hope. (Rom 15:4)

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- It promotes Holy Living. (2 Pet 3:11-12)

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- It compels us to share the Gospel. (1 Cor 15:52)

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- It brings blessing. (Rev 1:3)

# Is it okay for Christians to hold different convictions about Prophecy?

Yes, but...

#### We hold to the Facts...

- Christ will return for His own.
- No one knows when Christ will return, only God.
- He will judge the World.
- There will be a time of great trouble on the earth at the end of the ages.
- The final conflict will be won by Christ.

#### We hold to the Facts...

Satan, his angels, and those who are without Christ will be cast into the Lake of Fire forever.
Jesus will take his children to live on the New Earth with Him forever.

However, the facts only take us so far. There is not enough prophetic information to let us say with absolute confidence that we know exactly what's going to happen in the future in exact minute detail.

Beyond the Facts, there must be assumptions and speculations made, which lead to different understandings. When Christians' convictions about Prophecy become a point of conflict between believers...

- We are missing the whole point of biblical prophecy.
- We are missing an opportunity to influence the World.

# 3. The present is that part of the parade in front of the grandstand where we are sitting. 4. The future is that part of the parade still to come.

# The future, therefore, is no more of a mystery to God than the past.

## God's "parade of history," as it were, includes "five floats."

# Creation

#### What did God create? 7. Since God is the only uncreated thing in the universe, we know that He created everything outside of Himself.

## *What* did God create? 8. God created humanity to

exist on a level above anything else.

#### Why did God create?

10. For His glory (Isa 43:6-7)

You are worthy, O Lord, To receive glory and honor and power; For You created all things, And by Your will they exist and were created.

-Psa 19:1

## Why did God create?

11. Since humanity is created in God's image, and since it is clear that humanity delights in creating, then it also seems clear that the human desire to create might be part of the very nature and character of God.

### Why did God create?

12. Since God is love, it is not difficult to imagine that God's love is so overflowing & abundant that He wanted to create people whom He could love & would choose to love Him in return.

#### -J.I. Packer, God Has Spoken

"The truly staggering answer which the Bible gives to this question is that God's purpose in revelation is to make friends with us. It was to this end that He created us rational beings, bearing His image, able to think and hear and speak and love; He wanted there to be genuine personal affection and friendship,

two-sided, between Himself and us—a relationship, not like that between a man and his dog, but like that of a father to his son, or husband to his wife. Loving friendship between two persons has no ulterior motive; it is an end in itself. And that is God's end in revelation.

He speaks to us simply to fulfill the purpose for which we were made; that is, to bring into being a relationship in which He is a friend to us, and we to Him, He finding His joy in giving us gifts and we finding ours in giving Him thanks."

### A relationship of love and of glory: God's loving us and our giving Him glory.







A covenant is a binding agreement between two individuals, and God has initiated a series of venants with humanity. The same love that motivated God to create in the first place now motivates Him to redeem

US.

After the fall, God offered us a covenant that would bring about a partial restoration of His intention for us here on earth and a complete and full restoration of His intention for us in

eternity.

#### God promises to forgive and to redeem us if we will simply turn to Him in faith and ask Him to.





Christ was the fulfilment of God's OT Covenant promises for a Messiah to come to redeem humanity.


The picture of exactly who this Messiah would be, when He would come, and what He would do was not at all clear to Old Testament saints.



Some OT prophecies indicated that He would come as a lowly servant and that He would be humble and would suffer terribly.



Other prophecies indicated that the Messiah would come as a reigning King in great power and glory.



• It was difficult for OT saints & religious leaders to understand how to put the two pictures of the Messiah together. • As the "parade of history" has unfolded, we now have a fuller understanding – that the Messiah would come twice.

## Principle for interpreting many prophecies & fulfillments in Scriptures:

• Many prophecies are fulfilled partially in the now, the short-run, and then fully in the long-

run.

## Example:

• The Kingdom of God has already been inaugurated by Jesus at His first coming, but it has not yet come in its fullness and completeness. (Matt 12:28; Rom 14:17: 1 Cor 4:20; 15:24) Christ



-God created a world in perfect harmony, in which He could love humanity & be loved by humanity, in the glory & joy of full righteousness.





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-Jesus came as the promised Messiah, so sins would no longer be "covered," but now "removed," fulfilling the prophets and establishing a new covenant.







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24. The message of grace through faith in Christ is now transferred to the Church, as it functions as the "Body of Christ."

## Each member of the body:

25. Is given the Holy Spirit as a seal that guarantees his inheritance until the final day of redemption (Eph 4:30)

26. Is given a spiritual gift to use in the body of Christ, so it's ministry is effective (1 Cor 12; Rom 12)

## Each member of the body:

27. Is commissioned by Christ to participate in the evangelism of the world, making disciples to build the church (Matt 28:19-20)

28. Is given the responsibility to worship the Lord, to observe baptism & the Lord's Supper, maintaining a ready spirit until Jesus comes again in the fulfillment of God's covenant promises.

-lt was contaminat ed by sin, separated from God, and unable to correct situation.

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29. The completion of God's Redemptive Plan!

Consummation

30. When we see all of history as one parade passing by the grandstand, we can better envision that the future is merely the will of God already determined, but which has yet to OCCUr.



31. Properly seen, prophecy is just the culmination of the plan which God established before creation.

32. When the original plan was destroyed through the Fall, God instituted His recovery plan of redemption in 4 remaining stages...





33. The Consummation is an already accomplished fact in the mind of God, a "float" that has already been created, but which has yet to "pass the grandstand."



34. We don't know when the consummation of history will occur.

35. It should spur our evangelistic efforts.

36. We should live like citizens of Heaven, while we are citizens of Earth.

37. We should know that the suffering of this world will be swallowed up into the glory of the age to come.
