The son that left home. Luke 15:11-21

- His <u>sin</u>—making demands (I want what I want now!) and rebellion (I want my freedom now!). Luke 15:11-13; Gen. 3:1-7; Rom. 3:23; 6:23
- The consequences to his sin—he <u>lost</u> more than he gained. Luke 15:14-17; Heb. 11:25; Luke 12:13-21; 18:18-23; 1 Tim. 6:9-10; 1 John 2:15-17
- His response to his sin. Luke 15:17-21
 - He recognized he needed forgiveness and grace. Luke 15:17; 1 Pet. 5:6-7
 - He **<u>realized</u>** that he needed to come home. Luke 15:18-19
 - He **repented** of his sins. Luke 15:18-21

The sin that stopped him. Luke 15:25-32

- <u>His</u> sin. Luke 15:25-30
 - An attitude of <u>anger</u>, resentment and bitterness. Luke 15:26-30; 1 Sam. 18:1-8; Gen. 37:1-38; Eph. 4:26-27
 - An attitude of <u>self-righteousness</u>. Luke 15:29-30; 18:18-23; 18:9-14; James 2:10; Eph. 2:8-10
- His consequences to his sin. Luke 15:29-30
 - Put more <u>distance</u> between himself and his father and his brother. Luke 15:29-30;
 Gen. 37:1-37; Luke 18:18-21; 18:9-15; 15:31-32; Rom. 3:23; 6:23
- His response was he <u>rejected</u> the father's invitation. Luke 15:31-32; 2 Pet. 3:9; Luke 18:18-23; 18:9-15; Matt. 20:24-29

The father. Luke 15:20, 22-27, 31-32

- He extended his grace and forgiveness. Luke 15:20, 22-27; John 3:16; Eph. 2:8-10; 2 Pet. 3:9; 1 Tim. 2:4
- He extended his grace and forgiveness <u>hoping</u> and waiting for the elder brother. Luke 15:31-32; 1 Pet. 4:8; ls. 38:12; 43:25; Jer. 50:20; 44:22; 31:34
