What is the need? Luke 5:2-6

- Jesus had a need and <u>Peter</u> met that need. Luke 5:2-3; John 4:6-7; Luke 19:29-34
- Peter had a need and <u>Jesus</u> met that need (failure). Luke 5:2-6;
 John 4:13-19, 28-30; Luke 24:34, 39-47, 7:37-50, 19:1-10

What is the challenge? (Obedience) Luke 5:3-9

- The easy challenge of obedience is living in <u>shallow</u> water. Luke 5:3, 18:18
 -27; John 6:15, 66
- The hard challenge of obedience is <u>deep</u> water living. Luke 5:4-7, 18:24-28; Gen. 6:13-22, 12:4; Ex. 5:1; 1 Sam. 17:31-50; Josh. 6:1-20
- The challenge of obedience <u>leads</u> to confession of inadequacy. Luke 5:8-9; Is. 6:1-8; Ex. 33:20; 1 Tim. 6:16

What is the personal call to commitment? Luke 5:9-11

- God's will will <u>rock</u> our world. Luke 5:9-11, 19:8, 7:37-50; Acts 8:1, 3, 9:1-2
- God's will is not always <u>easy</u>, comfortable, or predictable. Luke 5:10-11; 2 Cor. 11:23-30, 12:1-10; Luke 9:23; Matt. 19:28
- God's will calls for us to <u>walk</u> daily with Christ. Luke 5:11, 9:23, 19:8
