Wisdom. James 1:5

What is wisdom (defined)?

"Wisdom is the <u>moral</u> discernment that enables the believer to meet life and its trials with decisions and actions consistent with God's will." Hiebert

Wisdom is not so much what we need to \underline{know} as what we need to do.

"Knowledge is horizontal; wisdom is **vertical** and comes from above." Billy Graham

Wisdom is the ability to apply the **facts** of life to practical life.

Knowledge is the what, whereas wisdom is the how. It is how to get through the multicolored trials in life, competent action to <u>master</u> the various problems of life.

- Ask for wisdom <u>without</u> doubting. James 1:6-8; 4:8; Eph. 4:14; John 20:24-29; 1 Kin. 18:21; Rev. 3:16

- Enables us to make the <u>right</u> decisions.
